Juliet Marillier - (although NZ born, she lives in Western Australia) - she writes historical fantasy, drawing on folklore and Celtic myth and legend. Her best series is The Sevenwaters series (I loved these); and again, I have read all of her books.

Miles Franklin - wrote *My Brilliant Career* (which was made into a movie) and is one of my favourite books.

Other notable Aussie authors are: Kate Grenville, Matthew Reilly (action thriller/espionage and young adult fiction writer), Thomas Keneally (wrote *Schindler's Ark* - became the movie Schindler's List), Bryce Courtenay, Markus Zusak (*TheBook Thief*), Colleen McCulloch (probably best known for *The Thorn Birds*), Kate Morton, Tim Winton and John Marsden (*Tomorrow When The War Began*).
